STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY



The Student Learning Survey (SLS) has been administered every year in B.C. public schools since 2001. The survey provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, learning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation.

Schools and districts use the SLS to make informed decisions around long-term planning and goal-setting, and in providing individual students personalized support. In 2021, the student survey underwent a review to accommodate an updated conceptual framework that align questions with the core competencies of the curriculum and the British Columbia's Policy for Student Success.

RED SEAL TAX CREDIT - 10% of wages, up to a maximum of \$2,000 per year, for Red Seal apprentices for the first

BASIC TAX CREDIT - 20% of wages, up to a maximum of \$4,000 per year, for non-Red Seal apprentices for the first two years.

COMPLETION TAX CREDIT - additional tax credits for employers that hire apprentices who are First Nations or have disabilities.

EMPLOYER TRAINING GRANT - up to two-thirds of the cost of training a employee, with a maximum of \$10,0

APPRENTICESHIP SERVICE SUPPORTS - Employers hiring new first-year apprentices in Red Seal trades can get up to \$10,000.
