IMPORTANT SAFETY BULLETIN

On April 8th, 2024 there will be a partial solar eclipse that will be visible during the school day.

The eclipse is at 11:44-1:35pm, with a maximum exposure at 12:39pm.

Unfortunately, there are health risks related to his type of partial eclipse.

Students will be welcomed to stay inside for the lunch break that day.

Schools will not schedule outdoor PE classes or activities for any students between 11:30am and 1:40pm on April 8th.

PRECAUTIONS

- Sunglasses do NOT provide adequate protection to view a solar eclipse
- After only a few seconds, there is risk for eye damage
- When a retina is damaged, it can take hours for symptoms to appear







NEVER LOOK AT THE SUN WITH THE UNAIDED EYE, INCLUDING DURING AN ECLIPSE OR OTHER

SOLAR PHENOMENA! ALWAYS USE ECLIPSE GLASSES OR VIEWERS.

THE SUN'S LIGHT

The Sun shines bright in our daytime sky, sending lots of light and radiation to Earth. Sunlight is very important for life on Earth, but it can also be harmful. Radiation emitted by the Sun can be harmful to humans without appropriate protection. Similarly, the abundance of visible light is just as damaging. Just like putting on sunblock or clothing to protect our skin from too much Sun, we also need to protect our eyes when observing the Sun.

SYMPTOMS OF EYE DAMAGE

Mild = headache, discomfort when looking at bright lights

More severe = blurry vision, blind spots, trouble seeing colours and shapes

If you experience any of these symptoms, please seek immediate medical attention



At maximum, the Moon will cover the entire Sun, leaving just the corona visible. You may remove your eclipse glasses to view the maximum of a total eclipse. Which solar eclipse are you viewing?

Take appropriate measures to ensure eye safety. All partial phases of any solar eclipse require a filter to observe safely.



At maximum, the Moon will cover all but a sliver of the Sun's surface. You must use proper eclipse glasses or viewers to observe this sliver.


